## 10 FREE THINGS TO DO IN DC

- 1 THE TRAILS IN ROCK CREEK PARK A scenic creek winds through 2,100 acres of parkland and picnic spots. DC Monuments by Moonlight Bike or walk among the glowing tributes to Washington, Jefferson and Lincoln as well as other iconic monuments and memorials.
- 2 THE RENOVATED MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. LIBRARY This 1972 gift from the Rockefeller Foundation features a new green roof, cafe, an interior atrium and more.
- 3 THE DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER MEMORIAL Check out the Frank Gehry-designed memorial to the nation's 34th president and Supreme Court Chief Justice.
- 4 BUREAU OF ENGRAVING & PRINTING See what millions of dollar bills like in person on a 40-minute tour. You'll pass a pair of giant pandas, a large elephant habitat and 390 other species of animals.
- 5 SMITHSONIAN NATIONAL ZOO Winding paths take you past a pair of giant pandas, a large elephant habitat and 390 other species of animals.
- 6 ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY Witness the eternal flame at the gravesite of President John F. Kennedy.
- 7 NATIONAL ARCHIVES Home to over three million records, the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights. Independence, the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights.
- 8 U.S. NATIONAL ARBORETUM The 445-acre space has more than 14,000 different plant species. A variety of fresh air.
- 9 NATIONAL GALLERY OF ART See over 14,000 paintings, drawings, photographs, sculptures and works of art.

## GETTING AROUND

### BY BUS

The DC Circulator ([dcccirculator.com](http://dcccirculator.com)) connects many neighborhoods and attractions. It costs \$1 and buses arrive every 10 minutes. SmartTricards offer discounted rates for bus and Metro transfers.

### BY CAR

Taxis in DC accept credit cards. Fares start at \$3.50 and are metered. A 15-20% tip is customary. Uber and Lyft also provide service throughout the metro DC area, and include options ranging from ride-shares to luxury SUVs.

### ON FOOT

DC has numerous public parks and walkable neighborhoods, making navigation on foot easy - especially with the very map you're holding.

### BY BIKE

Cruise around DC on a battery-powered scooter or one of the bike-sharing systems that serve the area, such as Capital Bikeshare. You can also rent wheels and a helmet from Unlimited Biking.

### BY METRO

The underground train and citywide bus system (Metrorail and Metrobus) make DC famously easy to navigate. Most major hotels and attractions are near Metrorail stops.

Tip: The new Silver Line connection to Dulles International Airport opens in 2021.
